# **Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP)**

# **Midpoint Entry**

The Concurrent Enrollment Program is a partnership between Maricopa County Community College District (MCCCD) and Arizona State University which allows nursing students the opportunity to complete their Associate of Applied Science (AAS) in nursing through their community college while simultaneously completing their Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) through ASU. CEP students take nursing coursework in-person at their community college and online through ASU. This program offers a time-efficient and cost-effective pathway to the BSN. Upon completion, students will graduate with their AAS in nursing from the community college and their BSN from ASU.

#### **Steps to Apply**

- 1. Visit links.asu.edu/cep and complete the online form to request information.
- 2. An ASU enrollment coach will connect with you to verify eligibility.
- 3. Once eligibility is determined, an ASU enrollment coach will provide you with next steps to apply for admission.
- 4. Midpoint applicants who meet the eligibility criteria and apply to ASU for the CEP will be admitted. Admission is based on eligibility and is not competitive.

#### **ASU Eligibility Requirements**

- Midpoint applicants must be enrolled in the MaricopaNursing program.
- A minimum 3.0 GPA in the following prerequisite courses is required. For options to improve prerequisite GPA, contact ASU.

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# Program Details and Graduation Requirements

**Plan of study**. The plan of study will be customized based on each student's unique academic history and current MaricopaNursing block. While in nursing blocks at MaricopaNursing, students take one ASU course at a time. During breaks, students can take additional ASU classes to make progress towards the BSN.

First courses at ASU include some or all of the following, depending on start term (summer, fall, or spring):

- 1. Statistics. *If needed. Can be completed at ASU or Maricopa (PSY 230 or MAT 206).*
- 2. TWC 361. If needed.
- 3. NUR courses, as prescribed by advisor.

**Graduation requirements.** 120 credits are required to graduate from ASU, including 45 upper division (300/400-level) credits. Depending on academic record, general studies completion may be required.

Up to 75 transfer credits will be accepted from the AAS nursing program. The CEP consists of 39 credits; students may need 6 credits of upper division general studies to meet ASU graduation requirements.
