Concurrent Associate Degree -Baccalaureate Degree Nursing Program (CEP)

The MaricopaNursing - Arizona State University Concurrent Enrollment Associate Degree -Baccalaureate Degree Nursing Program is offered through participating community colleges in the Maricopa Community College District and ASU. Participants are selected from students who have met the MaricopaNursing and ASU Associate - Baccalaureate CEP identified eligibility requirements and have applied to the MaricopaNursing Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP).

Did you know?

- Maricopa and ASU have created a Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP) for nursing students to simultaneously earn an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing and a Bachelor of Science (BSN) in Nursing.
- The MaricopaNursing ASU CEP is an educational pathway partnership designed to assist in meeting the Institute of Medicine 2010 Future of Nursing goal to increase the percentage of BSN RNs to 80% in Arizona by 2020.
- CEP students enroll in Maricopa and ASU classes at the same time.
- ASU CEP courses are offered completely online. ASU courses do not require an in-person commitment making work / life / school balance easier to manage.
- CEP students can graduate with their AAS and BSN in the same semester.
- BSN prepared nurses are highly valued by potential employers and MaricopaNursing ASU CEP graduates are equipped with the knowledge and skills of the new graduate baccalaureate prepared nurses.

ASU CEP PREREQUISITES

- First Year Composition (ENG 101 & ENG 102 or ENG 107 & ENG 108) *
- Chemistry (CHM 130 & CHM 130LL or CHM 138 & CHM138LL) * [high school chemistry is not accepted for our CEP]
- College Mathematics (MAT 142 or higher) *
- Introduction to Psychology (PSY 101 or PSY 240) *
- Human Anatomy & Physiology I (BIO 201) *
- Human Anatomy & Physiology II (BIO 202) *
- Microbiology (BIO 205) *

KEY INFORMATION

- Students must have a current application in the MaricopaNursing pool to be eligible for the CEP.
- All students must complete both the MaricopaNursing prerequisites and ASU CEP prerequisite courses noted above with a 3.00 GPA. (*To improve prerequisite GPA, up to two prerequisite courses may be repeated; only one English course may be repeated. For additional options to improve GPA, contact ASU at <u>asu.cep@asu.edu</u>.)*
- Students should review the CEP information presentation located at <u>maricopa.edu/degrees-certificates/healthcare-education/maricopa-nursing/cep</u>. This short presentation provides an overview of the CEP program. Students may elect to attend an in-person CEP information session offered at various MaricopaNursing campuses.
- Students applying for CEP admission are required to complete the <u>Information Session</u> <u>Declaration</u> indicating they have reviewed and understand CEP information.
- All MaricopaNursing courses are taught in the classroom, lab or clinical at a Maricopa community college. ASU courses are taught 100% online.
- Final determinations of transfer credits will be made by both MCCCD and ASU. Students with coursework from institutions other than MCCCD and ASU should have their coursework submitted for official evaluation through ASU's <u>Transfer Guide</u>.
- Application and acceptance to ASU is determined after eligibility into the CEP is finalized by MaricopaNursing.

• Students may enter the ASU CEP in blocks 1, 3, or 4. Currently enrolled MaricopaNursing students may enter the CEP as a midpoint student in blocks 3 or 4.

ADVISING

MaricopaNursing advisors are available for application advisement at Maricopa locations.

ASU advisors are located in the Phoenix-area and are available to meet in-person, via email or phone.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Pathway students may transfer up to 75 credits to ASU. Students with credits from a four year regionally accredited college or university may transfer up to 90 credits to ASU.

ASU TUITION

A reduced tuition rate of \$445 per credit hour is available. Tuition rates subject to change due to state budget appropriations. Textbooks, supplies, and course fees are additional.

FINANCIAL AID

Because federal regulations require that financial aid can only be disbursed through one college at a time, CEP students apply for financial aid through ASU and complete and sign a consortium agreement for financial aid disbursement.

Although the financial aid between the two programs is designed to work seamlessly, this cannot be guaranteed, so there may be times when you will be asked to pay your MaricopaNursing program tuition before you receive your ASU financial aid disbursement. You will need to be prepared to pay your MaricopaNursing program tuition out of pocket or by payment plan until the balance of your financial aid is awarded by ASU.

HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

MaricopaNursing and Arizona State University Edson College of Nursing & Health Innovation have Health and Safety Requirements that must be met prior to enrolling and participating in any clinical experiences. Healthcare agencies throughout the state require vaccinations, titers, and other healthcare related requirements (examples of these requirements are background checks, CPR, drug and nicotine testing, etc.) These requirements are subject to change per healthcare agency contracts with the educational institution. Students must be compliant with agency requirements prior to and throughout the program.

MaricopaNursing Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP) Model

STEP 1:	Student consults with MaricopaNursing advisement about the course requirements for MaricopaNursing and ASU CEP.
STEP 2:	Student applies to MaricopaNursing.
STEP 3:	Student views the MaricopaNursing CEP online information session or attends an in-person session and applies to CEP once they meet the requirements.
STEP 4:	MaricopaNursing Acceptance Committee determines if student is accepted or denied. Applicants are notified of acceptance by email. If accepted, student must confirm their intention to enroll in the timeframe requested by following the instructions on the acceptance letter.
STEP 5:	Accepted students also apply to ASU Admission Services as an ASU Online student. Once admitted, students will receive additional information from ASU about orientation and enrollment in courses.
STEP 6:	Accepted students attend the ASU Orientation Session at our Downtown Phoenix campus.
STEP 7:	After successful completion of MaricopaNursing blocks 1-4, student graduates with Associate of Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing from MCCCD and simultaneously graduates with a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing (BSN) from ASU.
STEP 8:	Student takes and passes NCLEX-RN licensure exam.
