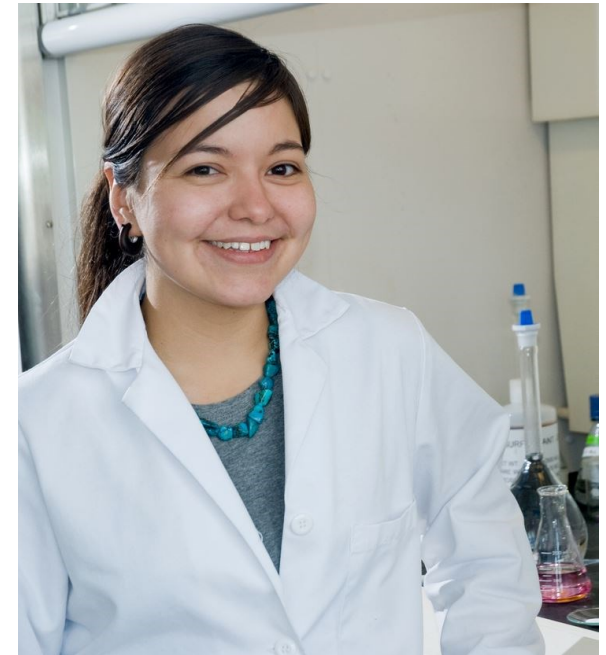

Requirements & Application Process

Requirements

- In “good standing” in your current nursing program and finished with your 2nd block of AAS nursing classes.
- Not missing more than 3 classes. Includes any of NAU’s Pre-Professional Requirements, or any of NAU’s liberal studies/diversity requirements.
- An Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) certification on your AAS transcripts or prior bachelor’s degree will cover the liberal studies/diversity requirements.
- A minimum of 3.0 GPA in all pre-professional requirements.
- Signed Advisor Approval Form showing “good standing” and 3.0 GPA or higher in current AAS nursing program . Form located in application.
- Must meet NAU’s diversity/liberal studies requirements.

Application Process

- Apply online to Northern Arizona University Undergraduate Admissions at Extended Campuses and submit all official transcripts from all colleges to NAU Undergraduate Admissions.
- Print out, complete and return NAU’s Mid-AAS Track application located at the School of Nursing website. Include all unofficial transcripts.
- May transfer up to 90 credits.
