Job Growth

Experts project behavioral health jobs in Maricopa County to grow by **35%** from 2022 to 2033, outpacing the **national average of 23%**.

Expanding Scholarship and Student Support

Program affordability is of prime importance to Maricopa Community Colleges, which has partnered with the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) to offer funding to behavioral health students.

- AHCCCS Scholarships: Glendale, Mesa, Phoenix College, Rio Salado, and South Mountain Community Colleges offer millions in scholarships to behavioral health students.
- Closing Equity Gaps: These scholarships provide affordable education and support for the home and community-based services workforce.

Prioritizing Short-term Stackable Credentials

TShort-term certificate programs are increasingly popular among students seeking quick upskilling options to re-enter the workforce (Schwartz, 2023).

- New Credentials: Maricopa Community Colleges now offers short-term credentials in Advanced Behavioral Sciences, Foundations in Behavioral Sciences, and more.
- **Intended Scope:** These short-term certificates cover the Behavioral Health Technician and Behavioral Health Paraprofessional scopes of practice.
- Seamless Transition: These credentials are embedded within associate and bachelor's degree programs for continuous education.



New Baccalaureate Degree Program

Maricopa Community Colleges continues to launch new programs to meet growing needs, including a **Bachelor of Science (BS) in Behavioral Sciences** at South Mountain Community College, one of the District's first baccalaureate degree offerings.
